The University of Washington (<http://www.uw.edu>) invites applications and nominations for the position of Dean of the College of the Environment. The College of the Environment is the UW's newest college, and the Dean will be its first permanent leader. The College spans all three campuses of the UW—Seattle, Bothell, and Tacoma. We seek a dynamic leader with the knowledge, vision, experience, and commitment to lead this new college into international prominence in all major issues related to the environment.

For decades the UW has been recognized as home to one of the strongest constellations of environmental intellectual talent in the world. In fulfillment of a vision for a bold, resourced, enduring, and effective environmental hub, the UW created the College of the Environment in June 2008. Designed to foster existing and new collaborations among outstanding faculty, staff, and students, it will partner with both internal University and external organizations in the Pacific Northwest and beyond to meet the needs of our students, our faculty, and society. It currently comprises 12 major academic, research, and outreach units (<http://www.coenv.washington.edu>).

Founded in 1861, the University of Washington is one of the oldest public institutions of higher education on the West Coast. The UW is a premier public research university and is ranked among the world's top 20 universities. The institution receives more federal research funding than any other public university in the United States and is second among all universities in total research expenditures.

The College of the Environment Dean Search Committee invites applications and nominations to be submitted to the Provost's Office. Nominations should include the nominee's name, position, address, and telephone numbers. Application materials should include a letter addressing how the candidate's background matches the position requirements, curriculum vitae, and contact information for at least six references. Confidential review of materials will begin immediately and nominations may continue until the appointment is made. It is preferred, however, that nominations and applications be received by December 15, 2009.
